This gives you a complete website package ready to run, as long as you are happy to accept it exactly "as is".

It installs quite easily, but offers little in the way of customisation. Eg, I did not wish to have the "book signings" links, to remove these requires editing several gif images and searching thru and modifying many lines of code.
